Welcome to your diabetic eye screening test. This test is to protect you from sight problems caused by diabetes.





The health worker will ask you to read letters or pictures on a chart. This is to find out how well you can see.



The health worker will use a special camera to take pictures of each eye.



The camera makes a bright flash when a picture is taken. Try not to blink.



The drops make things look bright and blurry after the test. This is normal, but don't drive for 4 hours.



The health worker will put some eye drops in your eyes.



There is a small dot in the camera for you to look at.



You will get a letter after 2-4 weeks telling you your results.
